Introduction

This report summarizes feedback from 168 of ??? participants who attended the 2018 TABSE State Joint Conference held for educators and/or school advocates on February 22nd thru February 26th, 2018.

The results of the participants are not a full representation of the views of all educational entities associated in TABSE. However, their feedback gives an interesting and informative picture that will help cultivate future enhancements and changes to support state wide educational professionals in relations to educating students in Texas of African American decent.

Brief Summary of Findings

Most participants learned about the conference through a TABSE/Local Affiliate member. Many were first -time attendees to a TABSE state conference based upon the awareness of the principles and values of TABSE prior to the event.


Participants were strongly supportive in attending the TABSE conference as opportunity of personal growth and development. In contrast, some had significant concerns about the event planning, timeframes, and the target audience of the conference attendees.

Majority of the participants expressed that the overall experience of the conference was excellent and deemed it to be extremely relevant to their profession and career advancement goals.

Participant Feedback


Upon the conclusion of the conference, attendees were asked to complete a survey with a series of questions with ratings and their overall experience including speakers and conference activities.

Q1. How did you hear or learn about this conference?




Responses show a that TABSE/Local Affiliate members have been spreading the word about TABSE. It also reveals that word of mouth has been the best marketing method for participants registering and attending the conference.

40% of attendees were first-timers a TABSE state conference and 39% have attended 2/more times within the last 5 years.

Q3. Are you currently a member of TABSE?




65% of attendees are current member of the TABSE organization. Findings show that membership has increased the level of engagement and understanding the intended mission of TABSE.

Q4. Please specify your reason(s) for attending this conference.




Participants were strongly supportive in attending the TABSE conference as opportunity of personal growth and development. The next two questions elicited a wide range of responses in how TABSE planning committee could consider for the upcoming and future conferences.





Recommended Actions

The recommended action points will be the subject of further discussion with TABSE conference planning team. This will inform future action in TABSE to increase capacity to implement a TABSE state conference.

Expected Outcome: Improve the educational achievement of African-American students by increasing the participation and expansion of Texas affiliates.

Recommended Actions:

1. For those attendees that are not a part of a local affiliate, provide them with information in their local area or provide the local affiliate contact information of the individual.
2. Increase concurrent workshops geared towards classroom and instructional time and focal point of early childhood education and special education.
3. Incorporate with children and disabilities, i.e. autism and behavioral.
4. Consider re-organizing the flow of accepting and notifying presenters. Please consider the flow of scheduling, locations, room size/table set up for popular speakers, registration fees and cancellations of presenters.
5. Provide links to speakers/presenter presentation on website
6. Look for opportunities to shorten the Awards Gala and more time for the ball component.
7. Expand the Coaches Strand beyond one day.
8. Principal Kafele could be consider one of the future luncheon speakers.
9. Consider school funding when selecting dates for early bird registration and the overall registration process when volunteers are assisting.
